THE 2024 BONSAI CALENDAR IS FULL OF OPPORTUNITY

As the 2024 repotting season draws to a close, I want to highlight some of the exciting news from the first quarter of this year. And, looking forward, we are anticipating great activities that will be happening throughout the bonsai community this year. We are also beginning to concentrate on planning the 2025 Bonsai Rendezvous. First, the end of February saw two of the Golden State Bonsai Federation legacy collections, the Bonsai Garden at Lake Merritt and the Huntington Botanical Garden Collection, had outstanding fundraising events. Congratulations to both collections on their success and a HUGE THANK YOU to the army of volunteers, donors and the generous bonsai enthusiasts that made these events so successful.

Second, a huge shout out to all the clubs and volunteers that have helped make tons of late winter and spring repotting and initial tree development workshops happen. All these hosted events have seen senior bonsai artists volunteer to help our newer generations of bonsai enthusiasts get started with repotting, grafting and initial tree styling. Studies show these events are the reason new enthusiasts join clubs. This is proving to be a very important factor of why our clubs and community are growing so rapidly, which is good for all of us.

And Third... following a wonderfully successful Bonsai Rendezvous last year, the GSBF board has voted unanimously to budget for a 'Give Back' program for the remainder of 2024 and the first 3 quarters of 2025! To accomplish this, a special GSBF committee has come up with numerous possible 'Give Back' ideas for GSBF member clubs to vote on. We believe that all these ideas have huge potential, but we are looking for input from each of our member clubs to select the 4 programs that they feel would most benefit their club and its members. Featured GSBF Board Member



Bob Hilvers discovered bonsai offered a pleasant diversion to the rigors of his job. His passion for the art soon turned into an avocation and finally it became a second career.

After thirty years in public safety, Bob accepted the position of Curator of Bonsai at the prestigious Clark Center for Japanese Art and Culture, which at the time did not have a bonsai collection nor any facility to house one. Bob, along with Bill Clark, the founder of the Clark Center for Japanese Art and Culture, established the origins of the Clark Bonsai Collection in Libby Clark's flower house. When the Clark Center ceased operations in 2014 Bob was instrumental in the transfer of the Collection to GSBF and the subsequent relocation of the Collection and construction of a new Bonsai Exhibit and Maintenance Facility in the iconic Shinzen Friendship Gardens in Fresno. All the while directing the relentless effort to build the Clark Bonsai Collection into what has become one of the finest public bonsai collections in North America.

In October of this year Bob will celebrate twentyone years as Curator of the Clark Bonsai. He has
been the Chair of the GSBF Clark Bonsai Collection
Committee since 2014. Bob is a charter member of
the North American Consortium of Bonsai
Collection Curators, is a past-President of GSBF and
has served on the GSBF Board of Trustees
continuously since 2002. Bob has been awarded the
GSBF President's Gold Medal twice and codeveloped the current GSBF Rendezvous concept.

Bob makes his home in Visalia, California where he lives with his wife, Candy, a "Boston Terror" named Zoe and a Ragdoll cat named Molly.


Meet the April Golden Zoom Presenter: Yannick Kiggen



Belgian resident, **Yannick Kiggen** began his bonsai journey by the age of 10. At 14 years of age, he formalized his journey with lessons from various Bonsai masters, including Kunio Kobayashi (Japan), Takeo Kawabe (Japan), Hotsumi Terakawa (Japan/Netherlands), Mario Komsta (Poland), Bonsai Studio Momiji (Belgium), Pius Notter (Switzerland) and Francois Jeker (France).

He has also participated in various exhibitions such as the Noelanders trophy, the Ginkgo award and the European Bonsai San Show.

In 2011 he founded Yama Bonsai Studio to promote Bonsai, share his knowledge and skills with both beginners and advanced people who are passionate about these beautiful trees. He has participated or conducted workshops, demonstrations, courses and lectures both in Europe and the United States and sales at his website.
